

Round table guidelines of the 11th JURE Conference

The purpose of a round table is to have an in-depth discussion on one or two central issues of your research. To make it easier for the participant to take part in the discussion, you have to make a hand-out of your research.

This includes:

1. A summary of your research:

- a. Title and authors
- b. Research problem statement or objective of the project
- c. Hypothesis or research questions
- d. And depending on your discussion questions information on your methods, analysis, results and/ or conclusions.

2. The one or two questions you want to discuss with the audience.

A hand-out should be as self-explanatory as possible so that your main job is to supplement the information it contains. To reach this aim, make it clear, structured, concise and attractive. Avoid long texts and use diagrams, graphs and tables can be used effectively to visualize your information.

The hand-out should not exceed the length of one sheet of A4.
